Surgery for Very High Risk to Oligometastatic Prostate Cancer

- * Highlighting the NCCN clinical practice guidelines in oncology which emphasize that surgery may be considered appropriate initial therapy for patients with high-risk, very high risk, or N1 disease in patients who have anticipated survival of at least 5 years or are symptomatic.

- * Prostate cancer is one of the most prevalent cancers in men worldwide. Treatment causes side effects such as urinary incontinence, bowel changes and erection problems influencing sex life and manhood. Cancer pathways are designed to give patients and their relatives a predictable and as stress-free as possible treatment trajectory and minimise waiting time.

Tumor Board Reviewing pT3N1M0 Locally Advanced Prostate Cancer

- * In this Clinical Case-Based Learning Educational Program, a Virtual Tumor Board in Advanced Prostate Cancer, a case of a 71-year-old man with a history of hypertension and locally advanced (pT3N1M0) prostate adenocarcinoma is presented, evaluated, and his treatment plan addressed.

Should Lutetium-prostate specific membrane antigen radioligand therapy for metastatic prostate cancer be used earlier in men with lymph node only metastatic prostate cancer?

- * Lutetium labelled prostate-specific membrane antigen radioligand therapy has shown pleasing early results in management of high-volume metastatic castration resistant prostate cancer (mCRPC), but its role in the early treatment of men with only lymph node metastasis (LNM) is unknown.

- * The Advanced Prostate Cancer Consensus Conference (APCCC) 2021 virtual meeting session discussing PARP inhibitors and beyond included a presentation by Dr. Dana Rathkopf regarding who needs germline testing and what should be tested.

- * The COVID-19 pandemic dramatically impacted society and health care on a global scale. To capture the lived experience of patients with prostate cancer and family members/caregivers during the COVID-19 pandemic, we performed a mixed-methods study of posts to two online networks.
