

Research Survey:

Sapiens Strategies Inc. is a research firm commissioned to recruit people living in Canada who received a diagnosis for prostate cancer to take part in a 30 minute telephone interview. To be eligible, participants should have a prostate cancer that can be treated by lowering testosterone and has spread outside the prostate.

The survey is about patient's perspectives on various dimensions of potential treatment options. The study is only about your opinion. It aims at understanding patient preferences for the administration features of therapies to treat prostate cancer and potential areas of improvement in the administration of these therapies that can address patients' current unmet needs.

The survey is being conducted by the Duke Clinical Research Institute. The study did obtain an ethic approbation from the Duke University Health System Institutional Review Board (IRB).

Participants will receive a monetary compensation of \$75 in recognition of their participation.

Management of Newly Diagnosed Metastatic Hormone-Sensitive Prostate Cancer: Review of Panel Responses and Discussion

- * In this session, Dr. Bertrand Tombal and Dr. Nick James summarized the panel responses to the consensus questions. This was followed by a discussion on the management of metastatic hormone sensitive prostate cancer (mHSPC) with input from the discussants and the panel.

Advances in Prostate Brachytherapy

- In an educational session at the American Society for Radiation Oncology (ASTRO) Annual Congress focused on the best treatment for early prostate cancer, Dr. Morton presented on advances in prostate brachytherapy. Dr. Morton began by emphasizing the NCCN clinical guidelines in oncology for prostate cancer recommend brachytherapy and EBRT as both appropriate treatment options for patients with favourable intermediate risk disease.

- Movember is launching the world's largest prostate cancer and testicular clinical and research network, aimed at improving the overall survival and quality of life for those living with diseases that affect over 1.4 million men worldwide every year.

<u>Prostate Cancer Treatment Overview: What's Changing - Summit 2021</u>

- * In this video featuring Dr. Alicia Morgans and Dr. Kelvin Moses, you'll gain a better understanding of all available prostate cancer treatment options. Also, you'll hear about updates on clinical trials and what's coming down the treatment pipeline so you can make the best decisions for you and your loved ones with your treatment team.

Considerations on the identification and management of metastatic prostate cancer patients with DNA repair gene alterations in the Canadian context.

- * Olaparib is the first Health Canada approved agent in metastatic prostate cancer to use a companion diagnostic to identify alterations in BRCA1, BRCA2, or ATM. As Olaparib is introduced, clinicians must learn to access and interpret germline and somatic nextgeneration sequencing (NGS) results, and how to manage affected patients who appear to have distinct clinical features.

<u>Biomarkers of Response to Neoadjuvant Androgen Deprivation in Localised Prostate Cancer</u>

- * Prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer deaths in men. Attempts to improve patient outcomes include trials of neoadjuvant androgen deprivation therapy for patients with high-risk disease. Neoadjuvant treatment refers to androgen deprivation therapy that is administered prior to surgery (or radiation therapy). Patients typically respond well to this treatment regimen, showing a decrease in tumour size, but a significant proportion of patients eventually relapse and progress to metastatic disease.

<u>Predictors of prostate cancer outcomes in Saskatchewan</u>

- Prostate cancer (PCa) is one of the leading causes of cancer mortality and incidence in Canada. Saskatchewan has one of highest mortality and incidence rates in Canada, and this doctoral research explores possible reasons for the higher mortality and incidence rates in Saskatchewan compared to the other provinces.
