Guest Speakers:

We are starting 2023 with a virtual meeting featuring Dr. Rob Rutledge and Dr. Gabriela Ilie, who are joining us from Nova Scotia "live" via Zoom. Wednesday February 15th at 7:00 pm.

In 2016, **Dr. Gabriela Ilie** was hired as **DMRF Endowed Soillse Research Scientist in Prostate Cancer Quality of Life Research**, at Dalhousie University with primary appointment in Community Health and Epidemiology, dual appointment in Urology, and cross appointments in the Departments of Radiation Oncology and Psychology and Neuroscience.

Dr. Ilie began to examine the needs and challenges of men diagnosed with prostate cancer, with the aim of actioning the findings into tangible programs aimed at improving the lives of prostate cancer survivors.

In 2018, Dr. Ilie partnered with a radiation oncologist, <u>Dr. Rob Rutledge</u>, who treats prostate cancer, and they began pooling on the available science to create an intervention that could actually support these men, and address the health gaps in education identified by the patients, to improve their mental health and quality of life.

Join us on Wednesday February 15, 2023 to learn more about <u>Prostate Cancer – Patient Empower-</u> <u>ment Program (PC-PEP)</u>, which they have now presented across Canada and around the world.

Genetic Risk Prediction for Prostate Cancer: Implications for Early Detection and Prevention.

*Prostate cancer (PCa) is a leading cause of death and partially heritable. Genetic risk prediction might be useful for strategies to reduce PCa mortality through early detection and prevention.

Family History of Prostate Cancer and Survival Outcomes in the UK Genetic Prostate Cancer Study.

Based on the investigation of the type and timing of relatives' cancers, it is likely that reductions in mortality are due almost completely to a greater awareness of the disease.

*Many prostate cancer patients also suffer from depression, which can decrease their life satisfaction and also impede recovery from their cancer.

*Although active surveillance (AS) is an increasingly adopted treatment paradigm for management of very low risk prostate cancer, many men and their partners face a variety of ASrelated psychosocial stressors.

*Recent oncology guidelines recommend BRCA1/2 testing for a wide range of prostate cancer (PCa) patients.

*December 2022

Prostate volume, baseline urinary function, and their association with treatment choice and posttreatment urinary function in men treated for localized prostate cancer.

*Benign prostatic hyperplasia, lower urinary tract symptoms, and prostate cancer often co-occur. Their effect on urinary function is an important consideration regarding prostate cancer treatment choices.
