


Prior BPH Surgery Ups Risk for Adverse Radical Prostatectomy Outcomes

Undergoing radical prostatectomy (RP) for prostate cancer after surgery for lower urinary tract symptoms due to benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH) is associated with higher rates of positive surgical margins and lower rates of urinary continence and erectile function recovery.

Investigators have identified 4 biomarkers related to metabolic processes in the body that are associated with an increased risk of metastatic prostate cancer in Black men, according to findings presented at the American Chemical Society 2023 Fall Meeting in San Francisco, California.



PSMA-PET shows value as a prognostic biomarker for recurrence in prostate cancer

In patients with prostate cancer considered for surgery, PSMA-PET can provide information on the risk of recurrence after surgery, before the surgery even happens. The imaging tool improves personalized treatments by helping the urologist decide whether or not to perform surgery, and to guide the surgical plan and the follow-up management after surgery August 2023
