### PETER MANSBRIDGE TALKS PROSTATE CANCER AWARENESS, REGULAR TESTING, AND THE ODDS FACING CANADIAN MEN

In support of the Light Up Blue campaign, Prostate Cancer Foundation Canada (PCFC) has released results of research conducted with Angus Reid Forum, which found that while 63 per cent of respondents said the men in their lives are aware of the benefits of getting tested for prostate cancer, 61 per cent say they procrastinate getting it done.

"It is one of those things where men are kind of resistant to the idea of getting tested," Peter Mansbridge, host of the Bridge and spokesperson with the campaign, tells Healthing.

#### Study shows ECOG score predicts overall survival outcomes in metastatic prostate cancer

ECOG performance status was determined to be a significant predictor of overall survival outcomes in patients with metastatic prostate cancer, according to a systematic review and meta-analysis of 75 studies.Across 72 studies, ECOG performance status consistently emerged as a key predictor of overall survival (OS) regardless of prior chemotherapy.

#### Bone Biomarkers Predict Survival in Hormone-Sensitive Prostate Cancer

Findings extend the clinical utility of circulating markers of bone metabolism in prostate cancer from the castration-resistant state to the hormonesensitive state.

High levels of bone turnover biomarkers predict shorter overall survival in men with newly diagnosed metastatic hormone-sensitive prostate cancer, not just castration-resistant disease, a new study finds. February 2024

#### Long-term follow up pinpoints side effects of treatments for prostate cancer patients

"Many men with localized prostate cancer survive for 15 years or more, with minimal differences in survival among various treatment strategies," said first author Bashir Al Hussein Al Awamlh, MD, a fellow in Urologic Oncology at VUMC. "Given this long-time horizon, and similar survival rates, the choice of treatment for patients may be influenced by the adverse effects of the treatments." (Study of nearly 2,500 U.S. men)

The premise underlying the concept of information blocking is simple: Patient access to, and sharing of, health care information should be the expected norm in the digital age. All certified EHR systems and their users are technically able to meet this expectation, so there should be consequences if an actor unreasonably interferes with that access or exchange of information. ### Most Men Choose Active Surveillance for Low-Risk Prostate Cancer

The researchers found that 57% of the study participants chose AS over definitive treatment (51% and 61% of Black and White participants, respectively). Older age, White race, and higher education were patient factors associated with initial AS uptake in an unadjusted analysis. None of these factors were significant predictors of AS uptake after adjustment for covariates. AS recommendation by a urologist was the strongest determinant of AS uptake (adjusted prevalence ratio, 6.59). February 2024 Renal & Urology News

# Plant-based diet tied to improved sexual health in men treated for prostate cancer

Previous research by the same team had already found that eating a plant-based diet may reduce the risk of developing the disease in the first place. Other investigations have connected this diet to a lower risk of sexual dysfunction in general but not specifically for those with prostate cancer, who are at particularly high risk for such issues. The new study, published online Feb. 13 in the journal Cancer, is also believed to be the first of its kind to show better urinary health in these patients based on nutrition.
