


Dr. Pienta on the evolving paradigm of PSMA-PET imaging

The advance of PSMA imaging has put an emphasis on multidisciplinary care. We now have a new imaging agent that identifies cancer that has spread outside of the prostate or is now oligometastatic. Now we are seeing, for example, therapy that requires surgery to take out the primary prostate, but potentially radiation also with it for an oligometastatic disease patient.

Studies launch of copper Cu 64 PSMA I&T PET/CT in prostate cancer

The SOLAR-STAGE (NCT06235151) trial is assessing the diagnostic performance of copper Cu 64 PSMA I&T PET/CT in the staging of men who have been newly diagnosed with unfavorable intermediate-, high-, or very high-risk prostate cancer and are planning to undergo radical prostatectomy with pelvic lymph node dissection (PLND).

Both trials are currently enrolling patients in the US, with additional sites expected to open in Europe later this year.

Projected estimates of cancer in Canada in 2024:

The study is the result of a collaboration between the Canadian Cancer Society, Statistics Canada, and the Public Health Agency of Canada. It provides estimates of the number and rate of new cancer cases and deaths in 2024 for 23 cancer types by province or territory, and sex. This is a major update with the inclusion of data from Quebec that provides more accurate national estimates.

Erectile and ejaculatory function preserved with Optilume BPH Catheter System

Treatment of lower urinary tract symptoms (LUTS) secondary to benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH) with the Optilume BPH Catheter System appears to preserve erectile and ejaculatory function in addition to providing relief from LUTS, according to a study presented at the 2024 American Urological Association (AUA) Annual Meeting in San Antonio, Texas.

New tool flags hidden sexual struggles in female partners of patients with prostate cancer

The partners of patients with prostate cancer grapple with their own quality-of-life issues that impact their sexual well-being, a new study shows. Using the first questionnaire of its kind, the authors uncovered key challenges faced by patients' wives and female partners, including difficulties with communication about their sexual needs, inadequate sexual health counseling by physicians, and feelings of isolation and loss of intimacy.Among all patients treated in the study to date, 60% demonstrated a PSA reduction of greater than 35%, and 27% demonstrated a PSA reduction of greater than 80%.

Active Surveillance Should Not Be Routinely Considered in ISUP Grade Group 2 Prostate Cancer

Level one evidence, although limited by noncontemporary grading of prostate cancer, shows that survival benefits of treatment versus observation are modest. However, the incidence of metastases in men on active monitoring in the ProtecT trial prompts caution when sharing decision making with patients harbouring intermediate-risk features willing to pursue active surveillance.

Salvage re-irradiation for locally recurrent prostate cancer following primary curative external beam radiation therapy (EBRT) is associated with favorable outcomes and acceptable toxicity, investigators concluded based on the results of a long-term follow-up study.

Ketogenic diet alters the epigenetic and immune landscape of prostate cancer to overcome resistance to immune checkpoint blockade therapy.

A ketogenic diet (KD) has been reported to enhance response to ICB therapy in some other cancer models. However, adverse effects associated with continuous KD were also observed, demanding better mechanistic understanding and optimized regimens for using KD as an immunotherapy sensitizer.

A newly published study by a Northeastern professor says that yoga might hold the key to restoring brain health in long-term cancer survivors in a manner unrivaled by aerobic exercise or stretching and toning exercises.

"It means we can offer exercises, we can prescribe yoga as a form of treatment or therapy for them to really be able to manage their cognitive complaints."

Researchers identify important gene in the fight against prostate cancer

"We've identified gene KMT2C, which is very important to the spread of prostate cancer. Loss of the KMT2C gene increases the risk of developing metastases. This can be relevant for both patients in the risk group and for understanding the disease," says Associate Professor Martin K. Thomsen.

Low testosterone in men associated with an early death

A limitation of the new study is that it is not able to figure out if low testosterone directly causes an increased risk of death. Testosterone is lowered by illness, so it could be a marker for an underlying disease that results in an increased chance of dying. This is especially true for diseases that have longterm inflammation, of which obesity is one.




Predictive Markers in Metastatic Prostate Cancer: Insights from the VISION Trial - Oliver Sartor

Use of PDE-5 inhibitors and beta-3 agonists in treating BPH

Similar to much of the work in this space, our findings are quite promising for these treatments. Phosphodiesterase-5 inhibitors, like tadalafil, for example, they not only help with prostate symptoms by relaxing the smooth muscle, but they also help improve erectile function.
