After 15 years in the banking industry, Cheryl went back to school and attained a degree in nursing, and later a specialization in Oncology Nursing in the United Kingdom.

She worked on a bone marrow transplant unit for several years before transferring to the Department of Radiation Oncology at the Tom Baker Cancer Centre where she was the Primary Care Nurse for men with genitourinary cancers. It was there that she established the first (in Alberta) Prostate Cancer Education Group which met weekly covering 7 different topics including Prostate Cancer 101, Sexuality and Prostate Cancer and 5 other topics.

She also travelled, speaking to a variety of groups about prostate cancer, and was the medical advisor for a 2-man play about prostate cancer. She had a poster presentation at a national oncology meeting in Ottawa, showing research on the benefits of education and group support for men with prostate cancer.

After 10 years at TBCC, Cheryl turned her sights to Palliative Care, and worked in Palliative Home Care and Hospice.

Now that she is retired, she has time to devote to helping men with cancer and their support people.

She hopes she can be a productive member of Prostaid Calgary by serving as a Director.


Bone-Protecting Agents Reduce Fracture Rate in mCRPC

Results suggest bone-protecting agents should be used in patients with metastatic castration-resistant prostate cancer and bone metastasis, especially in the era of androgen receptor pathway inhibitors.

A study led by UCLA investigators shows that artificial intelligence (AI) could play a key role in improving treatment outcomes for men with prostate cancer by helping physicians determine who is most likely to benefit from partial gland cryoablation, a minimally invasive procedure that treats localized prostate tumors.


Study finds genetic factors behind aggressive prostate cancer

"We found that prostate cancer follows a common evolutionary path, with different tumors branching off depending on early genetic changes and an individual's inherited genetic background. Some tumors may become aggressive because of specific mutations, while others remain indolent. Both genetic randomness and inherited traits play a role in determining these outcomes."


Cu-67 SAR-bisPSMA Granted Fast Track Designation for Metastatic CRPC

The FDA has granted ⁶⁷Cu-SAR-bisPSMA fast track designation for the treatment of adult patients with prostate-specific membrane antigen (PSMA)— positive metastatic castration-resistant prostate cancer (CRPC) who received prior androgen receptor pathway inhibition (ARPI)

Al helps predict kidney function decline in Lu-177 patients

Lu-177 PSMA-I&T is a drug similar to Lu-177 PSMA-617 (Pluvicto, Novartis) being evaluated in Europe for treating metastatic castration-resistant prostate cancer. The drug delivers targeted internal radiation to tumors, yet substantial absorbed doses have also been measured in various non-target organs, such as the kidneys, the authors explained.


Study confirms safety and efficacy of higher-dose-per-day radiation for early-stage prostate cancer

A new large-scale study co-led by UCLA Health Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center investigators provides the strongest evidence yet that a shorter, standard-dose course radiation treatment is just as effective as conventional radiotherapy for prostate cancer, without compromising the safety of patients.

New Partnership May Expand Use of Prostate Cancer Al Technology Platform

According to the press release, use of the AI platform may allow urologists and radiation oncologists to make informed treatment decisions before therapy at the time of biopsy for active surveillance and after surgery or radiotherapy. The platform is designed to decode hidden information from complex morphological structures across cancer pathology landscapes, which may help predict patient outcomes, treatment responses, and genotype mutations.

In a post hoc analysis of patient-reported outcomes in the EMBARK study, enzalutamide monotherapy significantly delayed deterioration in sexual interest, activity, satisfaction and erectile function compared with androgen deprivation therapy (ADT) alone

Checking PSA levels too soon after prostate cancer surgery can lead to overtreatment, study suggests

In a paper published in Jama Oncology Mass General Brigham researchers found that the current standard monitoring time of one-and-a-half to two months following surgery is too short to accurately identify recurrence and inform treatment decisions. Rather, PSA levels should be measured for at least three months to avoid overtreatment.

Prostate cancer 'is not a death knell': Early detection and personalized care improve outcomes, study shows

Prostate cancer statistics can look scary: 34,250 U.S. deaths in 2024. 1.4 million new cases worldwide in 2022. Dr. Bruce Montgomery, a UW Medicine oncologist, hopes that patients won't see these numbers and just throw up their hands in fear or resignation.

Study finds new potential for prostate cancer immunotherapy

Warfel's team discovered that the overexpression of PIM1 kinase in tumor-associated macrophages was a driver of resistance to immunotherapy. By inhibiting PIM1 kinase in conjunction with an immune checkpoint inhibitor, Warfel's team was able to reduce cancer tumor growth in laboratory and animal models of prostate cancer.


Waterjet surgery for enlarged prostate can offer relief without compromising sexual enjoyment, trial finds

There are several surgical approaches for BPH. The most common option, transurethral resection of the prostate (TURP), uses a heated wire loop to shave away excess prostate tissue. A previous five-year trial has shown aquablation can significantly reduce the risk of retrograde ejaculation as a side effect compared with TURP.

Researchers learn how a drug called zotatifin kills cancer cells

The scientists tested zotatifin against prostate tumor biopsies that were transplanted into mice. This type of experiment, called a patient-derived xenograft, is considered a gold standard for showing a drug's potential to beat cancer in the laboratory.

The prostate tumors, which had been growing relentlessly in patients, shrank in response to zotatifin in the mice.

Exercise key to improving sexual dysfunction for patients with prostate cancer, study says

In the first study of its kind, now published in *JAMA Network Open*, Professor Galvão explored the impact that regular exercise and the introduction of psychosexual education and a self-managed intervention (PESM) had on sexual function and sexual satisfaction of patients with prostate cancer.


Healthy Lifestyle Choices May Reduce Risk of Death in Prostate Cancer Patients

To evaluate lifestyle, the researchers used the 2021 Prostate Cancer Behavior Score, which incorporates body mass index, total physical activity, and smoking status. The researchers also conducted analyses incorporating this score along with dietary factors, including intake of saturated fat, whole milk, alcohol, and processed meat.


